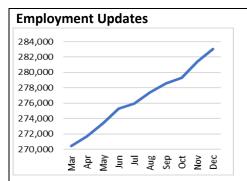
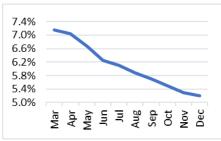

# **COVID Recovery Monitor**



In the nine months since March 2021, the number of Tees Valley **payrolled employees** has increased by 12,650.



Over the same period, those on Universal Credit Searching for Work has fallen from 7.1% to 5.2%.



**Job Vacancies** saw a dramatic fall in December 2021, down 42% from November. This fall is likely due to the changing macro-economic conditions, but monthly changes can be drastically effected by seasonal factors therefore caution is needed when studying monthly changes in vacancies.

### **Business and Consumer Confidence**



North East businesses with 'high' confidence in December has fallen to 76.1% from 76.4% in the previous wave. However, this figure remains well above the UK level of 70.2%.



41.0% of North East businesses in December have a workforce which have returned to the workplace; compared to 51.6% in the previous month. The fall can be attributed to the introduction of work from home advice due to the Omicron variant.



UK Consumer spending in December was up 12.2% compared to the same period in 2019. However, the introduction of Plan B due to Omicron resulted in non-essential spending to fall 11.5% and therefore affecting business throughout the UK. January's UK GfK Consumer Confidence Index fell by four points to –19, due to fears of higher prices and increasing interest rates. This is the lowest score observed since February 2021, when the index was at -23 and is down from recent highs of -7 in July 2021.

## **Movement of People**



Regionally Road/Traffic usage has fallen 5.0% month on month in January 2022; fuelled by a decrease in all forms of usage, primarily cars and pedestrians & cyclists.





Google Mobility Data shows that workplace footfall is down around 18% from prepandemic levels. This is due to the work from home advice due to the Omicron variant. Additionally, retail footfall is down 11% likely due to the fall in consumer confidence levels.



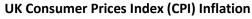
Teesside Airport passenger numbers in December (5,798) were down 16.7% on that for November 2021. However, this is up from lows of 2,022 in March 2021. Nationally, passenger numbers are down 6.6% month on month in December 2021.

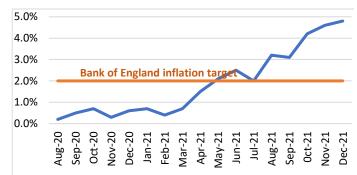
Cargo ship and tankers visiting Tees and Hartlepool ports increased by 10.2% in January month on month but down by 0.4% from February 2020. This matches the national trends, with a 3.1% increase month on month in January 2022

- The Bank of England aims to keep CPI inflation within 1% either side of its 2% target.
- UK Inflation climbed to 4.8% in December, up from 4.6% in November and up from just 0.6% in November 2020.
- The continued high level of inflation is primarily due to contributions from transport (i.e., motor fuels and second-hand cars) as well as housing and household services.
