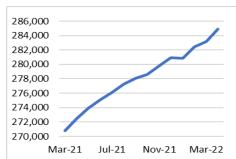

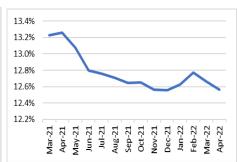

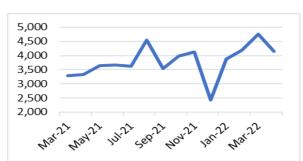
Employment Updates



In the year since Apr-21, the number of Tees Valley payrolled employees has increased by 12,464 to 284,901 in Apr-22 has fallen from 13.3% to 12.6%.

Job Vacancies decreased by 12.9% in April 2022 from the previous month. They have fallen back below the highs seen in August 2021 by 9.0% but are still 71.1% above the lows seen in December 2021.

Business and Consumer Confidence

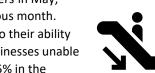


The main concern of 31.5% of North East business is inflation, with a further 20.1% of mainly concerned with the rising energy prices.

37.6% of North East businesses have been experiencing a shortage of workers in May; compared to 38.4% in the previous month. This is having a knock on affect to their ability to trade with 38.3% of these businesses unable to meet demands, down from 45% in the previous month.



UK Consumer spending in April was up 18.1% compared to the same period in 2019. The latest month saw the continued resurgence in face-to-face spending, with card spending increasing by 8.8% for bricks and mortar retailers, which is the largest increase since September.

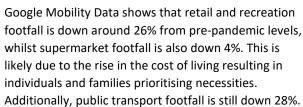


May's UK GfK Consumer Confidence Index fell by three points to -40, due to fears of higher prices through inflation and increasing interest rates. This is the lowest score since records began in 1974, below the previous record set during the financial crisis of 2008 and the overall index is down from recent highs of -7 in July 2021.

Movement of People

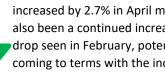


Regionally Road/Traffic usage has risen 7.7% month on month in April. This increase may be tied to a gradual return to the office for some workers and the shift towards the summer months.





Teesside Airport passenger numbers in April (14,216) were up 104% on that for March 2022. The increase in passenger numbers during April can be linked to the easing in COVID measures as well as seasonal variations due to an increase in flights during the runup to the summer months.



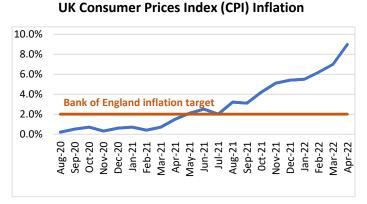

UK GDP increased 0.8% in 2022 Q1



- The Bank of England aims to keep CPI inflation within 1% either side of its 2% target.
- UK Inflation climbed to 9.0% in April, up from 7.0% in March 2022 and up from 1.5% in April 2021.
- The continued high level of inflation is primarily due to large upward contributions from housing and household services (i.e., energy costs) as well as transport (i.e., motor fuels and second-hand cars).
