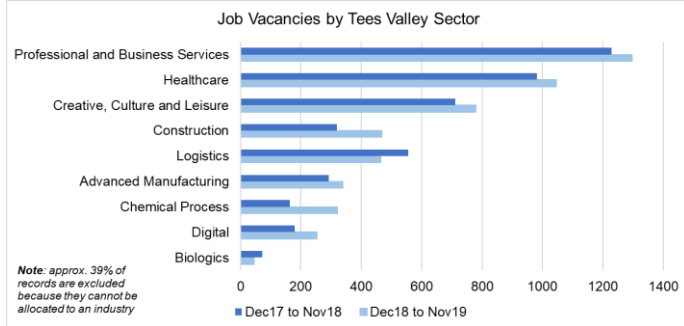

Economic Resilience Update

This section examines a range of recently published metrics that provide an indication as to the economic resilience of Tees Valley.

Tees Valley Job Vacancies

There was a 5% fall in the number of job vacancies advertised in Tees Valley between year to November 2018 and year to November 2019 (1,340 fewer vacancies). This compares to a 18% fall nationally.



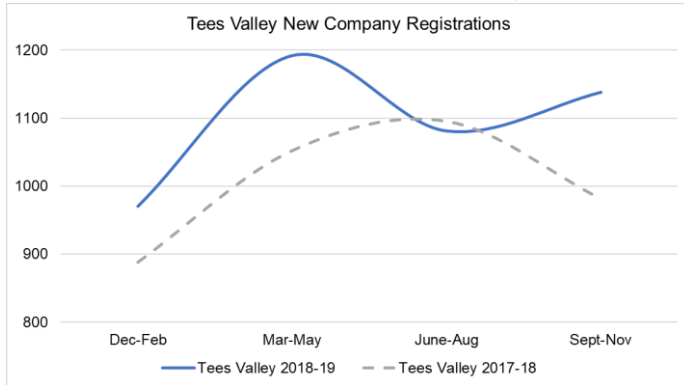
There was an 96% increase in Chemical Process vacancies (157 extra) followed by a 46% increase in Construction (148 extra) and a 41% increase in Digital (74 extra).

Biologics saw the largest fall of 36% (26 fewer vacancies), followed by a 16% drop in Logistics vacancies (91 fewer).

Please note: A fall in job vacancies does not necessarily indicate fewer jobs, it may be an indication of increased job stability or lower staff turnover.

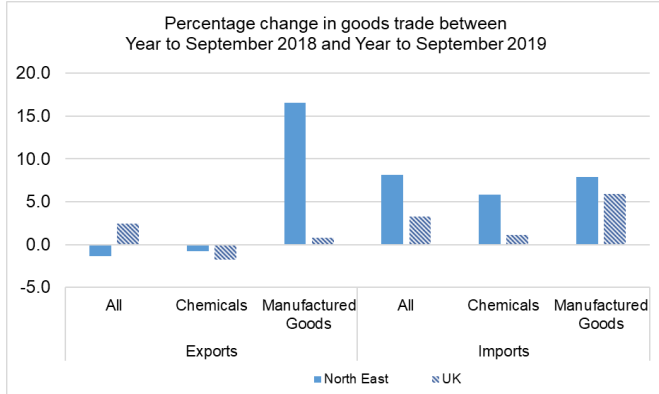
Tees Valley New Company Registrations

There were 1,138 new Companies House registrations in Tees Valley during Sep-Nov 2019, up 16% from 981 between Sep-Nov 2018, this compares to a 0.3% fall nationally.



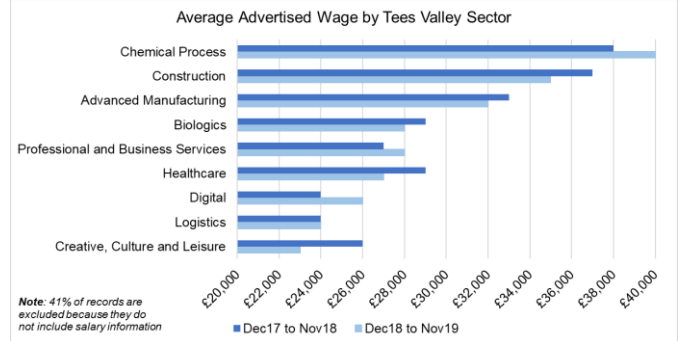
North East Trade in Goods

The aggregate effect of increasing imports alongside decreasing exports has led to a decrease in the regions balance of trade.



Tees Valley Average Advertised Wage

The Tees Valley average advertised wage was £30,000 in the year to November 2019 compared to £34,000 nationally. Both figures are the same as the previous year.



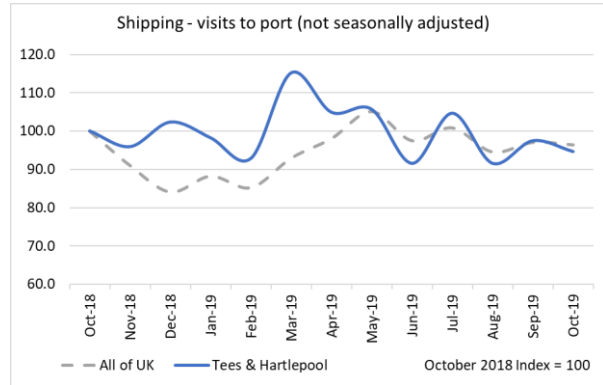
The Digital sector saw the largest increase with a rise of 8.3% (£2,000) followed by Chemical Process with a rise of 5.3% (£2,000) and Professional & Business Services increasing by 3.7% (£1,000).

Creative, Culture and Leisure saw the largest fall with a drop of 11.5% (-£3,000). This was followed by Healthcare with a fall of 6.9% (-£2,000) and Construction with a fall of 5.4% (-£2,000).

Please note: rounding in this dataset has recently changed from the nearest £100 to £1,000.

Tees & Hartlepool Port Visits

Visits to Tees & Hartlepool port saw a fall of 5.4 percentage points since October 2018, from 389 to 368 in October 2019. This compares to a 3.6 fall across all of the UK.



UK Productivity

Manufacture of Pharmaceuticals saw a fall of 12.2 percentage points over the last year followed by Transport Equipment with a 9.1 fall. Rubber & Plastics fell by 8.7 and Chemicals fell by 4.6.
